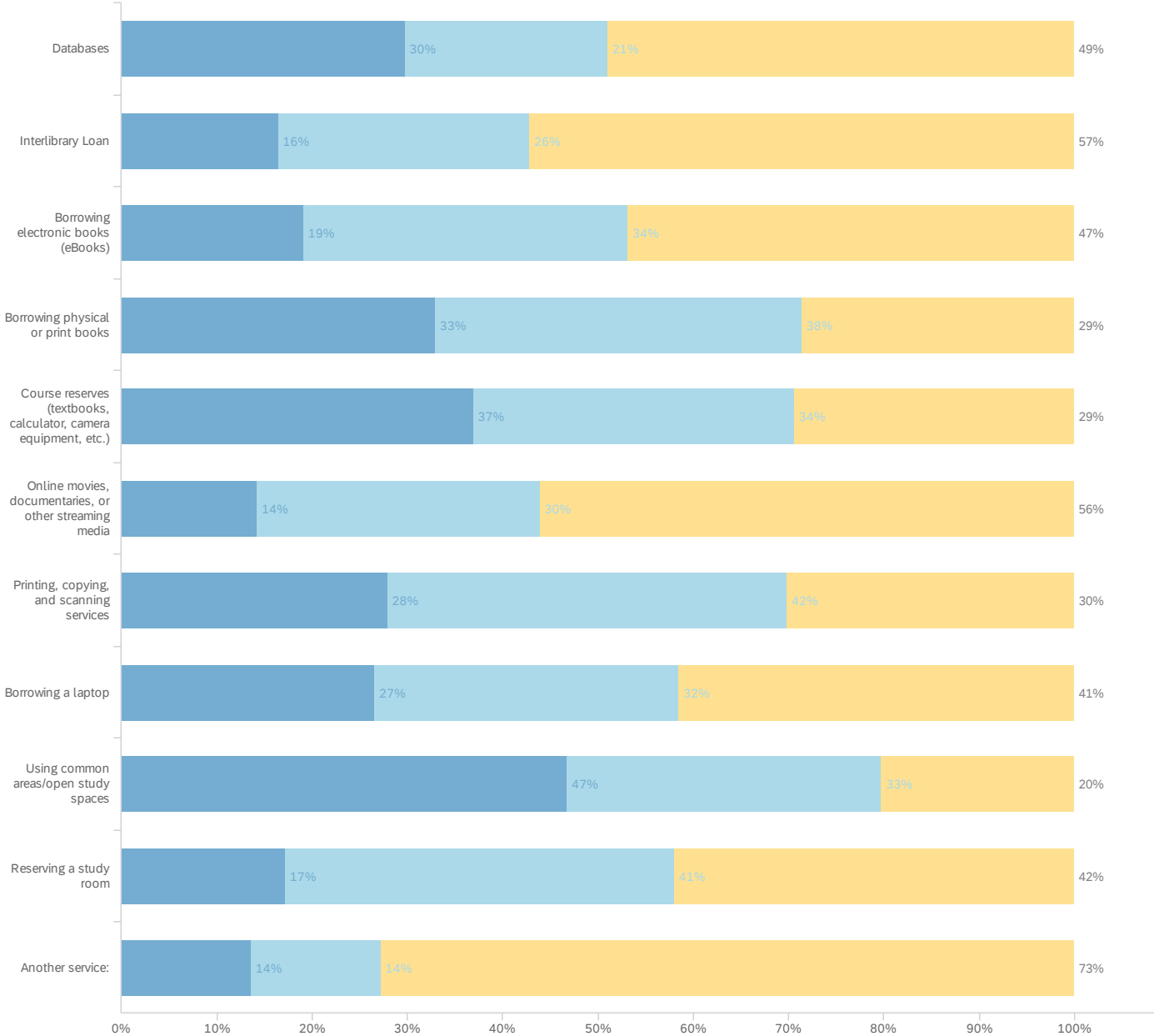

Book rentals are only for a few hours and you must remain in the library. I use the high yech center to study due to accommodations

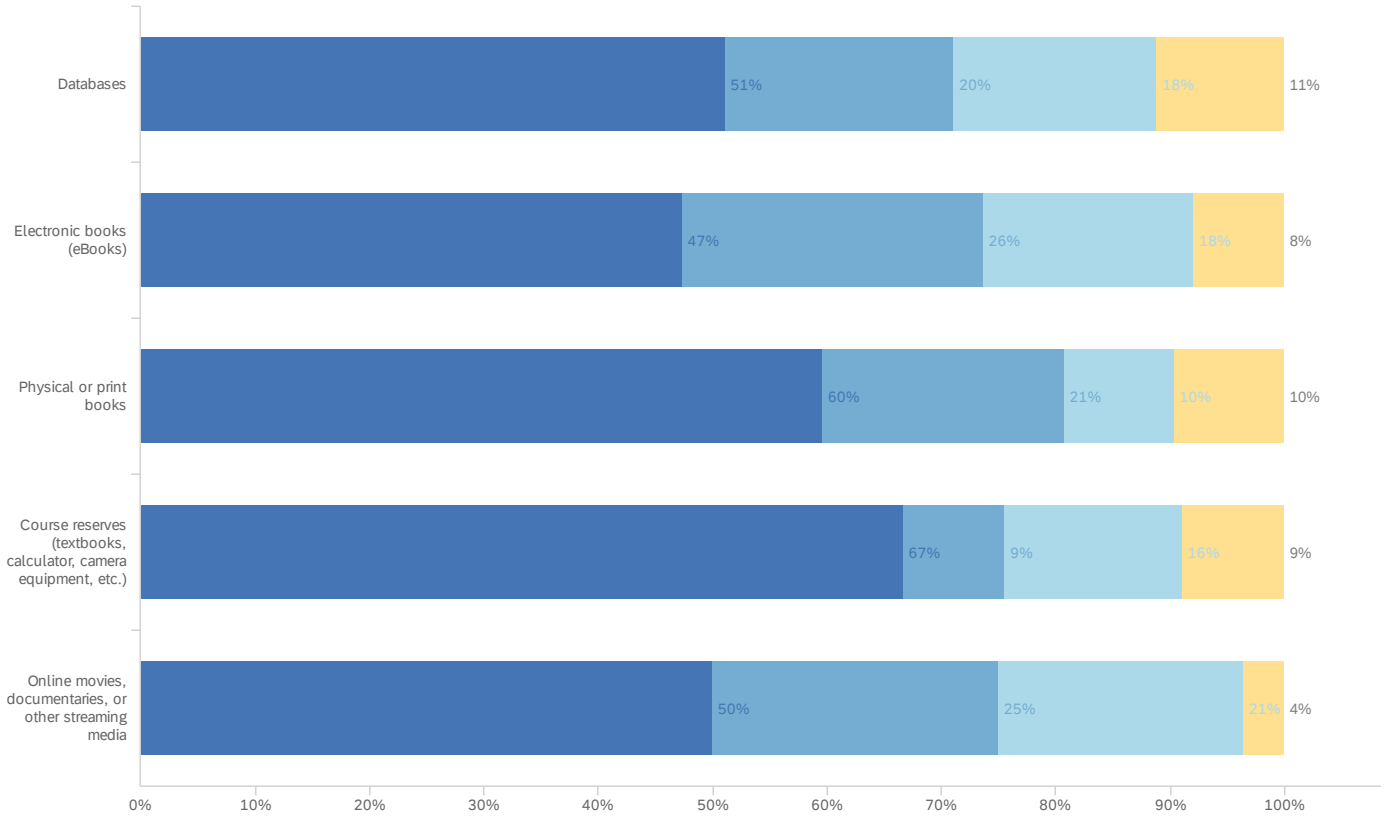
No one really introduced me or talks about it.

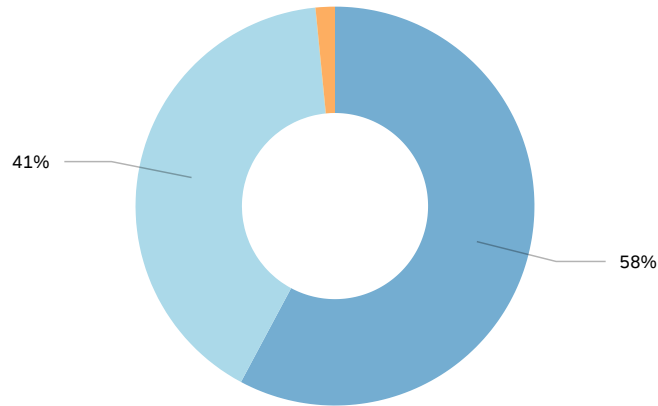

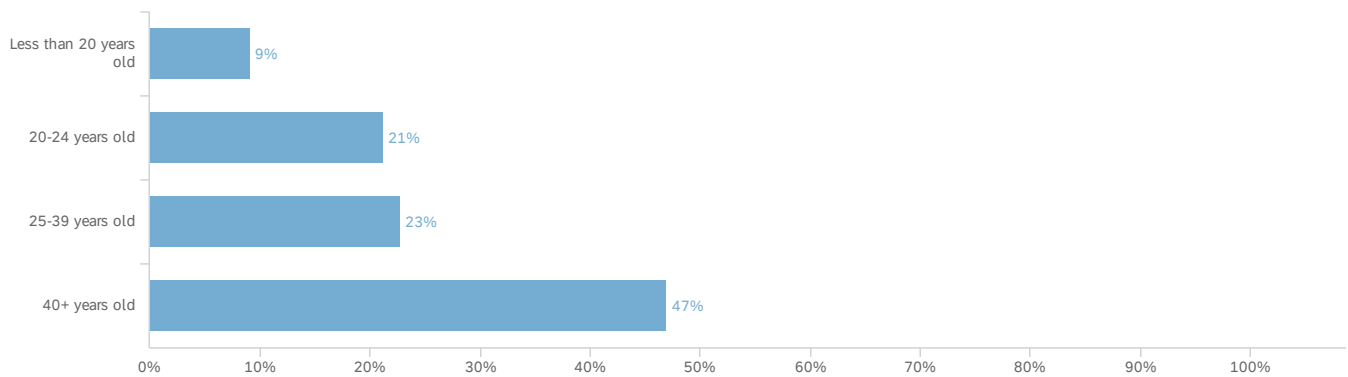

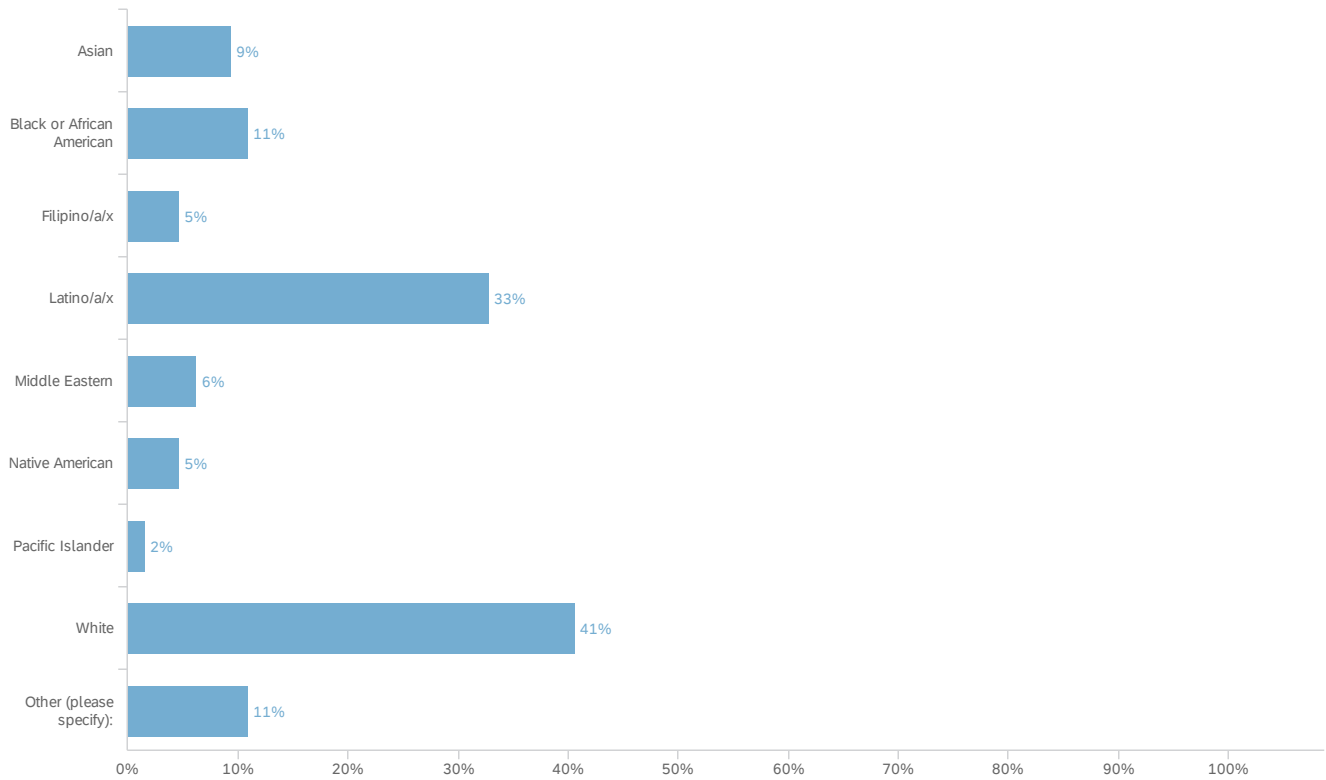

Q20 - What is your age?



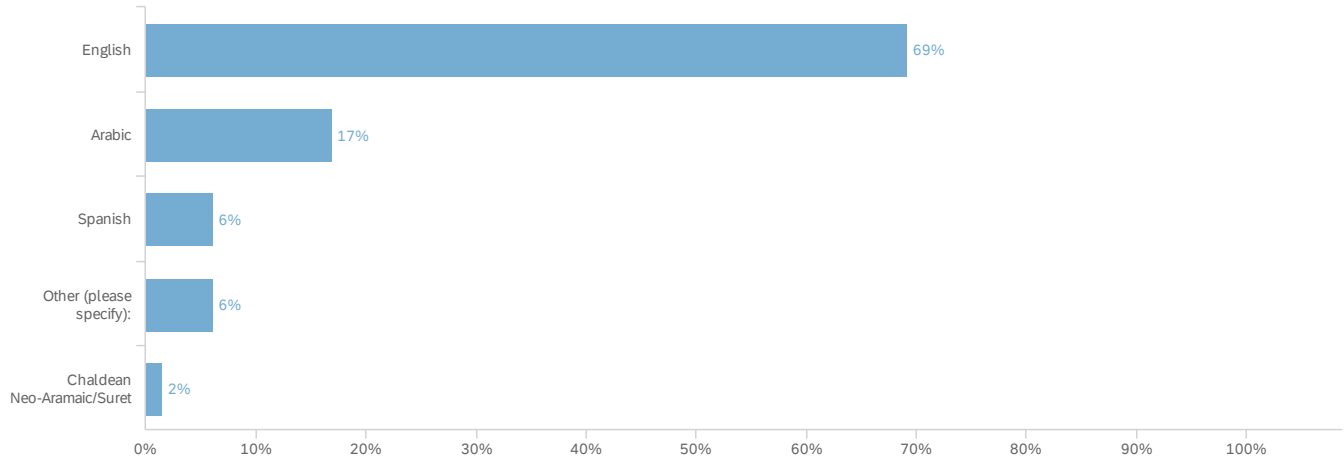

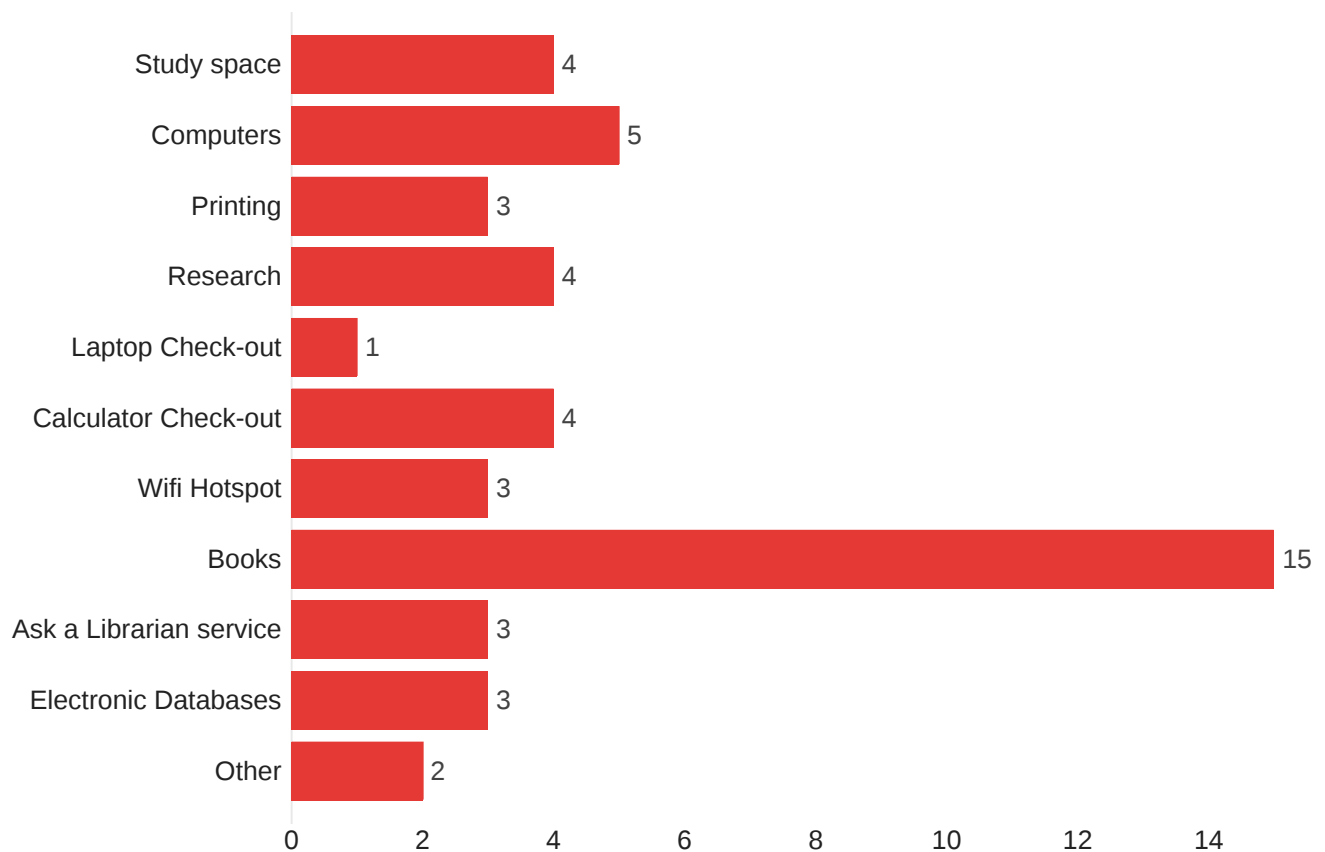
What is your area of study?



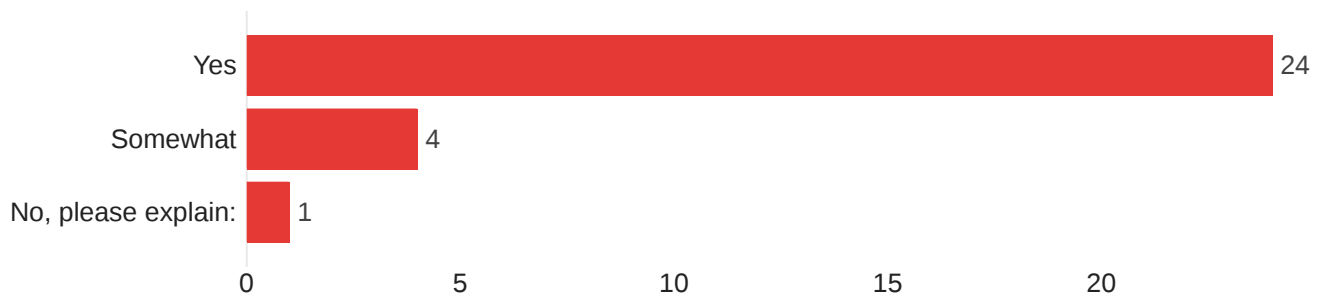
On average, how often did you use any library service in the last year (2021-2022 academic year)?



Which services did you use in the last year? Please select all that apply.



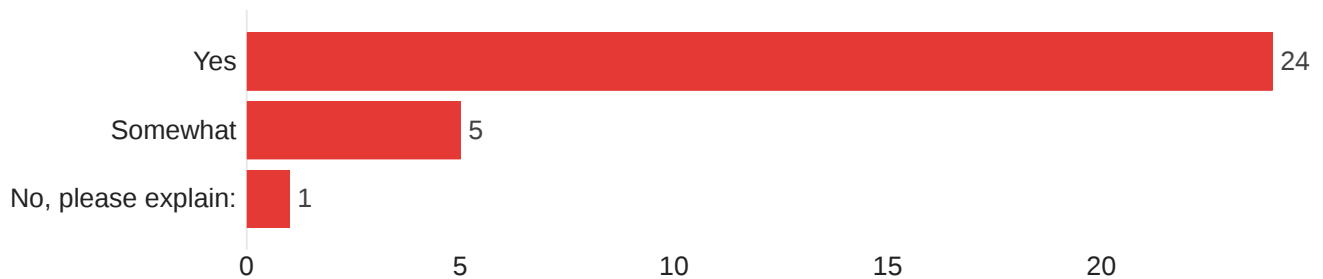

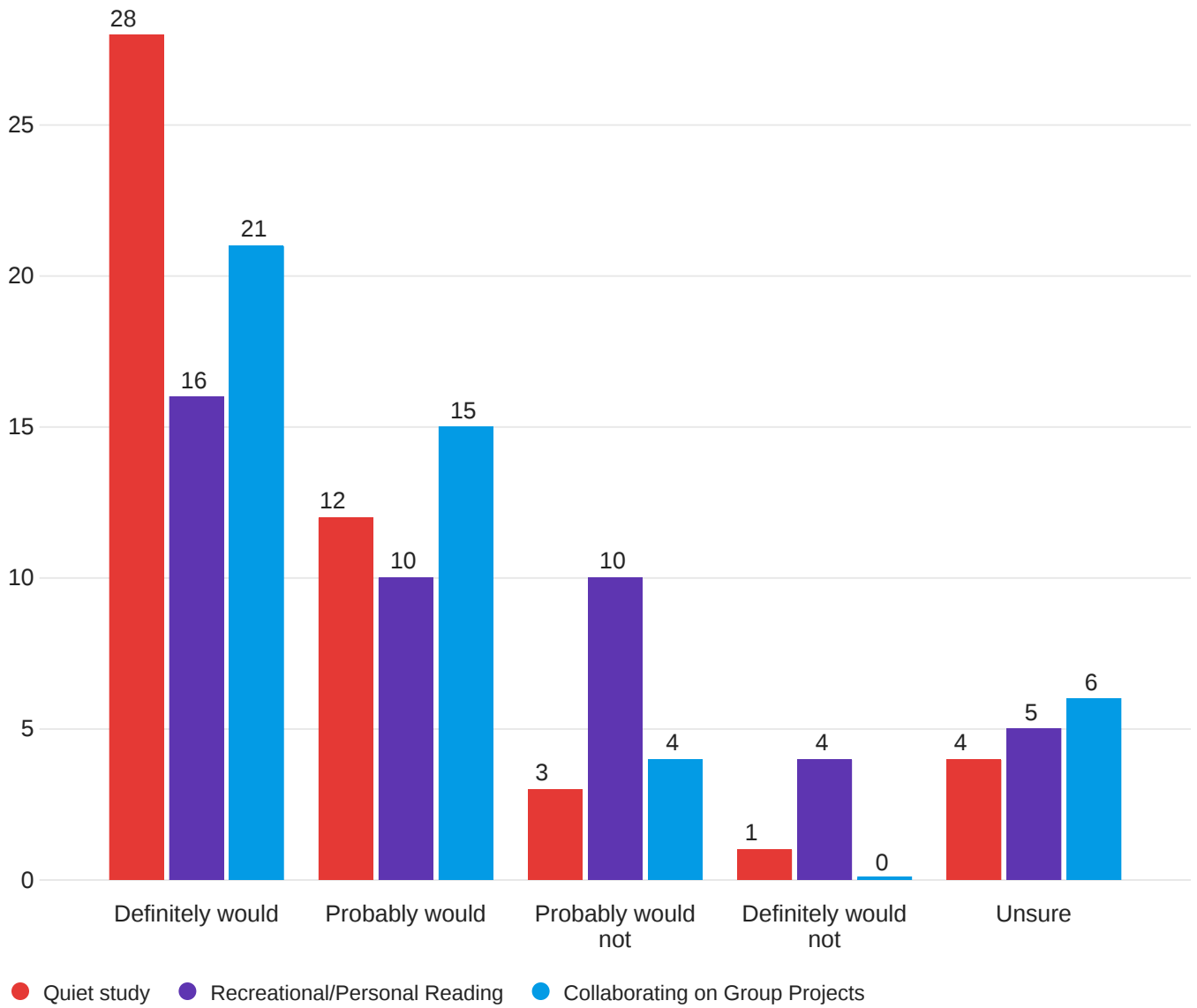

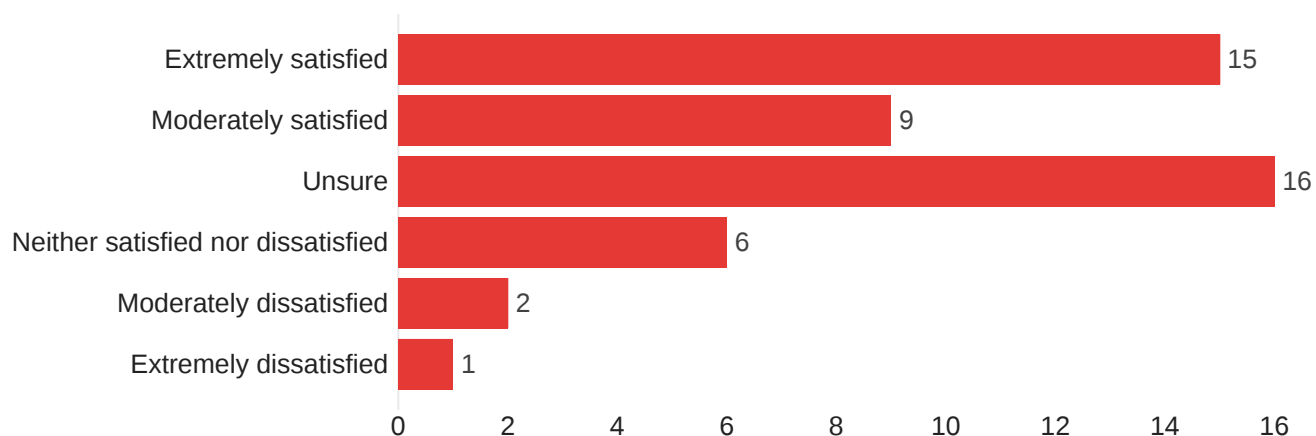

How satisfied are you with the library's current printed book selection?



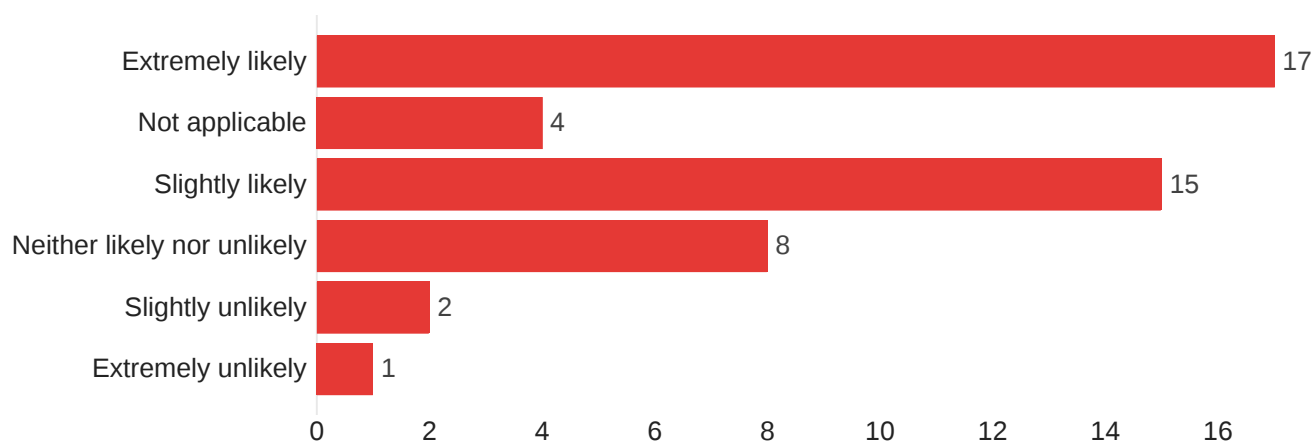

GCCCD's Return-to-Campus Planning Student Survey Spring 2021

Executive Summary

Background and Survey Administration

To help inform the Grossmont-Cuyamaca Community College District's (GCCCD) return-to-campus planning in Fall 2021 and beyond, Cuyamaca College's Institutional Effectiveness, Success, and Equity (IESE) office, in partnership with Grossmont College's College Planning and Institutional Effectiveness (CPIE) office and GCCCD's Research, Planning, and Institutional Effectiveness (RPIE) office, administered a survey to all GCCCD students who were enrolled in Fall 2020 and/or Spring 2021, or had applied for admission in Summer or Fall 2021. The goal of the survey was to assess students' preferences for online or in-person classes and services.

The survey was administered from April 22 through May 17, 2021 via SurveyMonkey. Students who had not responded received weekly reminders to complete the survey. In total, 29,786 students received a survey invitation via email, and there were 6,113 valid responses, resulting in a 21% response rate. Invalid responses included students who indicated they might enroll at GCCCD in Fall 2021 but then skipped all or the vast majority of the subsequent survey items. The electronic survey instrument is available in [Appendix A](#).

Respondent Characteristics

Compared to survey recipients, survey respondents included a slight underrepresentation of Latino/a/x students (36% compared to 38% of survey recipients), a sizeable underrepresentation of men (29% compared to 40% of survey recipients), and a slight overrepresentation of students age 40 years or older (12% compared to 14% of survey recipients). These discrepancies between survey recipients and respondents are not unusual for online surveys ([Smith, 2008](#)).

Approximately 74% of students who completed this survey indicated they primarily attend Grossmont College, while the remaining 26% primarily attend Cuyamaca College. Slightly more than half of respondents (53%) have attended GCCCD for less than four semesters.

The majority of respondents identified as women (69%). Approximately 43% identified as White, 36% as Latino, 10% as Middle Eastern or North African, 9% as Asian or Asian American, 8% as Black or African American, 5% as Filipino, 3% as Native American, 1% as Native Hawaiian or other Pacific Islander, and 4% identified with another race/ethnicity. The majority of respondents were less than 25 years old (59%). See [Appendix B](#) for detailed counts and percentages of all respondent characteristics.

Approximately 94% of respondents indicated they might enroll at GCCCD in Fall 2021: This includes 80% of respondents who indicated they plan to enroll, 14% who indicated they are not sure whether they plan to enroll, and less than 1% of respondents who skipped this survey item but completed the majority of the subsequent questions related to their preferences for the Fall 2021 semester. The remaining 6% of respondents indicated they do not plan to enroll. Some of the reasons for not enrolling include graduating and/or transferring before Fall 2021, being concerned about health risks, lacking necessary resources and support to attend college, and wanting to wait until additional in-person instruction is offered.

The remainder of this report focuses on respondents who indicated they might enroll at GCCCD in Fall 2021, which includes respondents who indicated they plan to enroll, are not sure whether they will enroll, or skipped this survey item. See [Appendix C](#) for detailed counts and percentages of these respondents' characteristics and their responses to each survey item.

Summary of Preferences of Students Who Might Enroll at GCCCD in Fall 2021

While nearly one in four students (23%) would prefer to take all of their GCCCD classes in person in Fall 2021, a larger percentage would prefer to take online classes (33%) or a mix of online and in-person classes (41%), and the remaining respondents (3%) do not have a preference for either online or in-person classes.

When taking online courses, many students would prefer a mix of synchronous and asynchronous aspects—in other words, they would prefer that online courses provide opportunities for live sessions with their instructor and other students, as well as some self-paced content.

If returning to in-person classes requires routine COVID-19 testing, vaccination against COVID-19, and/or quarantining after potential exposure to the virus, many students indicated these health and safety precautions would lead them to take classes online instead of in person.

Nearly half (49%) of respondents indicated that concerns about other students not following COVID-19 safety protocols would impact their decision to take in-person classes. Other concerns that would have an impact included students' work schedules (43%), concerns about family members' health (40%), and concerns about their own health (38%).

Students had mixed preferences for online and in-person services. There was a slight preference for the following services to be in person: Library, Student Engagement events and activities, Bookstore, High Tech Center, Counseling, and Tutoring. Conversely, there was a slight preference for Assessment, Admissions and Records, and Test Proctoring services to be online.

The vast majority of students (92%) indicated they would like to receive information about return-to-campus planning via detailed emails, and almost half (47%) would like to receive this information through the Canvas learning management system.

Recommendations Based on Survey Responses

Based on students' preferences for online and in-person classes and services, the following action items are recommended as we continue to engage in return-to-campus planning for Fall 2021 and beyond:

- Provide options for online and in person courses across all Academic and Career Pathways (ACPs).
 - Include both synchronous and asynchronous components in online courses.
 - Clearly communicate GCCCD's health and safety measures to students in advance of priority registration so this information can inform students' course registration decisions.
- Optimize student services for both online and in person delivery.
- Provide timely, detailed information to students regarding GCCCD's return-to-campus plans, course offerings, and service availability online and in person.
- Provide students with detailed emails and leverage Canvas to communicate information about the return-to-campus plans.

Preferences of Students Who Might Enroll in Fall 2021

Preferred Course Modality

Approximately 41% of respondents who indicated they might enroll at GCCCD in Fall 2021 (i.e., respondents who indicated they plan to enroll, were not sure whether they would enroll, or skipped this survey item) would prefer a mix of online and in-person classes. One third of respondents indicated they would prefer all of their classes online (33%), and nearly one fourth (23%) indicated they would prefer all of their classes in person. The remaining 3% of respondents indicated they do not have a preference for either modality.

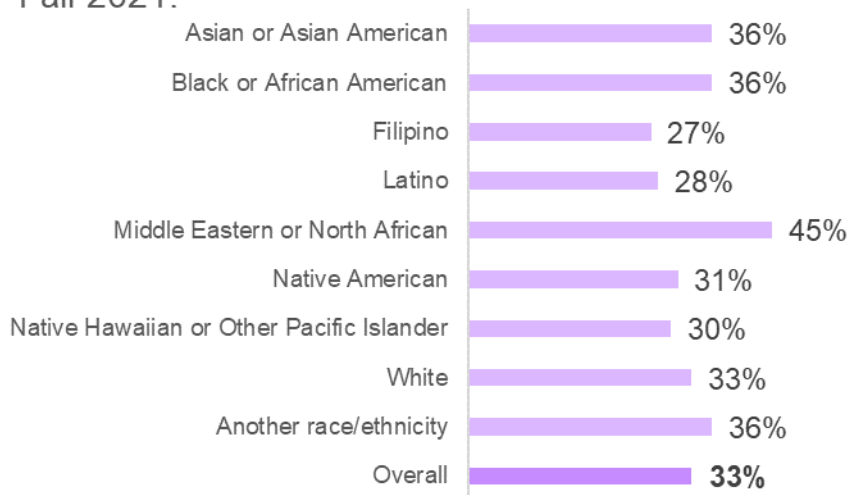
Many students who indicated that Grossmont is their primary college would prefer a mix of online and in-person classes in Fall 2021, and nearly one in three would prefer all of their classes online. For students who indicated their primary college is Cuyamaca, approximately 37% would prefer a mix of online and in-person classes, and a similar percentage would prefer all of their classes online.

Preferred Course Modality by Race and Ethnicity

There were variations in students' preferences for online or in-person classes based on their race or ethnicity. Approximately 45% of students who identify as Middle Eastern or North African, and approximately 36% of students who identify as Asian, Black, and/or another race or ethnicity would prefer all of their classes online.

Students who identify as Asian, Black, Middle Eastern, and/or another race/ethnicity are more likely to prefer that all of their classes be online in Fall 2021.



Students who identify as Asian or Asian American, Middle Eastern or North African, and/or Native Hawaiian or other Pacific Islander are less likely to prefer that all of their classes be in-person in Fall 2021. Students who identify as Filipino, Latino, and/or Native Hawaiian or other Pacific Islander are more likely to prefer a mix of in-person and online classes, or do not have a preference for either modality.

Preferred Course Modality by Academic and Career Pathway

Compared to the 33% of all students who indicated they would prefer all of their classes online, students in the Behavioral and Social Sciences, Business, and/or Language and Communication Academic and Career Pathways (ACPs) were more likely to indicate that they would prefer all of their classes online (34%, 42%, and 38%, respectively). Compared to the 23% of all students who indicated they would prefer all of their classes in person, students in the Humanities and/or the Visual and Performing Arts ACPs were more likely to indicate they would prefer all of their classes in person (34% and 30%, respectively).

Reasons for Preferring All Classes in Person

Students were asked to explain their preference for in-person and/or online courses in Fall 2021. Their verbatim responses are listed in [Appendix D](#).

The 449 students who indicated they would prefer all of their classes in person and who provided an explanation for their preference gave the following reasons for this preference (please note that some open-ended comments are associated with multiple themes, so the sum of the percentages below exceed 100%):

- More than half said they learn better in person (63% of responses)
- Some find it easier to focus and pay attention in person because there are fewer distractions than at home (15% of responses)
- Some need or want to take courses that require hands-on learning, like science, math, nursing, automotive, athletics and exercise science courses, performance courses (theater, music, etc.), and language courses (15% of responses)
- Some believe that in-person classes provide better social interactions with students' peers and instructors, and that this is an important part of the college experience (12% of responses)
- Some feel like there is better communication among students and instructors, or it is easier to get help when students have questions in person (10% of responses)
- Some feel more motivated in person, and are experiencing burnout and exhaustion learning online during a pandemic (6% of responses)
- Some are struggling with mental and physical health issues that could be improved through in-person courses, and some explained that the routine of going to in-person classes positively impacts their health (4% of responses)
- Some feel like in-person classes involve more structure, discipline, and/or accountability, which helps students be more responsible, manage their time better, prioritize school, and/or distinguish between school and home life (4% of responses)
- A few feel that it is safe to return because they and/or many others will be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 by Fall 2021 (2% of responses)
- A few have had issues with low-quality online courses where they feel like they need to teach themselves, their instructors are not engaged in the course, or their instructors struggle with Canvas and other instructional technology (2% of responses)
- A few want in-person courses so they can also access in-person resources and services, like Tutoring or access to technology (2% of responses)
- A few want GCCCD to provide hybrid options in which students who want to attend in person can, and the course sessions are recorded and streamed for students who do not want to attend in person (1% of responses)
- A few noted that there are no technology issues in person (1% of responses)
- A few feel like it is time to go back (1% of responses)
- A few have difficulty taking exams or submitting assignments online (1% of responses)
- A few think going back in person should be fine if we follow COVID-19 safety precautions (1% of responses)
- A few believe the pandemic is under control (<1% of responses)

“Online learning is very difficult for me, and I am eager to return to an environment in which I can interact with my professor and peers in order to help me learn.”

“While online classes were for the most part good, it was hard to focus with there being many distractions.”

“The classroom atmosphere helps me focus better. I also love in-person socialization with my peers. It helps me stay invested in the class.”

- A few said they would prefer to either have all of their courses in person or all online so they do not have to commute from campus to participate in online classes at home, and vice versa (<1% of responses)
- One wants to go back to in-person courses but would not feel safe without being vaccinated
- One wants to go back to in-person courses but would have an issue wearing a mask
- One thinks we should stop believing political lies about COVID-19

Reasons for Preferring All Classes Online

The 646 students who indicated they would prefer all of their classes online and who provided an explanation for their preference gave the following reasons for this preference (please note that some open-ended comments are associated with multiple themes, so the sum of the percentages below exceed 100%):

- Slightly more than half said they were still concerned about health risks due to the ongoing pandemic (52% of responses)
- Some think online classes are more convenient (29% of responses). Some of the reasons students gave include the following: they save time; they save money; they do not need to commute; they have a better balance between school and life; they have a more flexible schedule; they experience fewer distractions; and instructors are more lenient online.
- Some find it fits better with their work schedules (16% of responses)
- Some are responsible for taking care of children or other family members (9% of responses)
- Some would not be able to attend in-person classes because they live too far away or have concerns about transportation (7% of responses)
- Some have concerns about relatively low vaccine rates or others lying about their vaccination status (6% of responses)
- Some believe they learn better online (6% of responses). Some of the reasons students gave include the following: they are able to focus better; they can go through the course material at their own pace; and they can spend more time with course materials by reviewing recorded course materials multiple times.
- Some have physical and/or mental health issues (e.g., social anxiety) that make taking in-person classes more challenging than online classes (3% of responses)
- Some are concerned about students or others on campus following COVID-19 health and safety protocols (2% of responses)
- Some would prefer that all classes that are offered in-person were also offered online so students would have options (2% of responses)
- Some are afraid to get vaccinated against COVID-19, and would have concerns about a vaccine requirement (2% of responses)
- A few said they do not want to wear a mask during in-person classes (1% of responses)
- A few had concerns about the safety of our institutions, including proper sanitization and the ventilation in our classrooms (1% of responses)
- A few indicated they are high school students, and that online courses fit with their high school schedule, or that they had concerns about attending in-person classes with older students (<1% of responses)

"I like the convenience of having my classes online, as I am able to spend less time commuting. With that, I am able to pick up more hours at work to sustain myself during these times."

"Life is busy. Online makes school for a mom possible"

"I do not feel safe coming back to in campus learning. If classes are online then larger class sizes are possible and all students will be able to stay on track in their education plans."

- A few said they would prefer asynchronous online classes with no scheduled sessions or no Zoom sessions (<1% of responses)
- A few are concerned that in-person classes with physical distancing requirements would lead to smaller enrollment maximums, thus making it even more challenging to enroll in certain classes they want or need to take (<1% of responses)
- A few have concerns about the efficacy of COVID-19 vaccines (<1% of responses)
- A few feel more welcomed or experience less bullying, harassment, and discrimination online (<1% of responses)

Preferred Online Instructional Modality

Approximately 40% of respondents indicated they prefer a hybrid or mix of synchronous aspects (e.g., some live sessions and meetings with their instructor and other students) and asynchronous aspects (e.g., self-paced content) in their online courses. Nearly one in three (32%) indicated they prefer asynchronous online courses, and one in five (21%) indicated they prefer synchronous online courses. The remainder (7%) indicated they do not have a preference.

For online courses, many students whose primary college is Grossmont would prefer a mix of synchronous and asynchronous aspects. For students who indicated their primary college is Cuyamaca, approximately 35% would prefer a mix of synchronous and asynchronous aspects in their online courses. Cuyamaca students were slightly more likely to prefer asynchronous online courses (34%) than Grossmont students (31%).

Preferred Online Instructional Modality by Academic and Career Pathway

District-wide, students in the Behavioral and Social Sciences, Business, and Humanities ACPs were more likely to prefer asynchronous online classes (38%, 38%, and 35%, respectively) than students in other ACPs (32% overall). Students in the Humanities ACP were less likely than others to prefer online classes with a mix of asynchronous and synchronous aspects (28% compared to 40% overall).

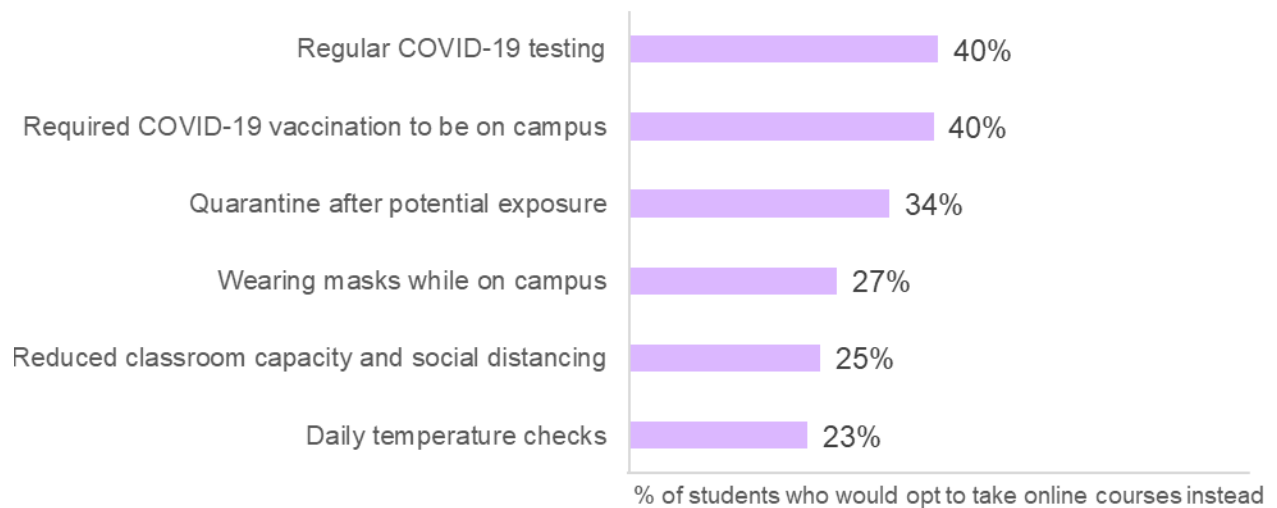

Impact of COVID-19 Protocols on Enrolling in Person

Because returning to in-person classes in Fall 2021 might require taking certain health and safety precautions, students who would consider taking in-person classes in Fall 2021 were asked whether certain precautions would impact their decision to take in-person classes and thus cause them to take online classes instead. Regular COVID-19 testing/screening, required vaccinations, and the need to quarantine after potential exposure to the virus were the three precautions that would impact these students' decision to take in-person classes the most. Wearing masks while on campus, having reduced class sizes and physical distancing, and daily temperature checks would also impact some students' decision to take in-person classes.

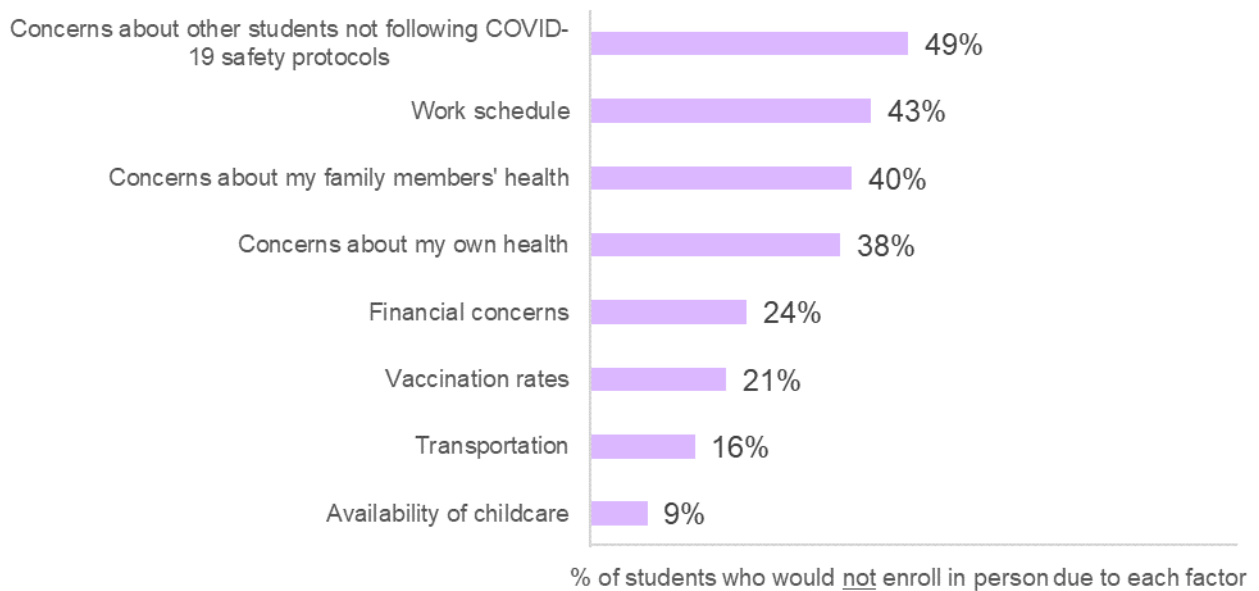
Many students who would consider taking classes in person in Fall 2021 indicated that requiring COVID testing, vaccination, and quaranting after potential exposure would cause them to take online classes instead.



Factors that Would Impact In-Person Course Enrollment

Students were asked whether certain factors would cause them to not enroll in person in Fall 2021 and beyond. Nearly half of respondents (49%) indicated that concerns about other students not following COVID-19 safety protocols would impact their decision to enroll in-person classes, such that it would cause them to not enroll in person. Approximately 43% indicated their work schedule would have an impact, 40% indicated concerns about their family members' health would have an impact, and 38% indicated concerns about their own health would have an impact. Almost one in four noted that financial concerns would impact their decision, and over one in five indicated that concerns about vaccination rates would impact their decision.

Many students indicated concerns about other students following safety protocols, their work schedule, and/or health concerns as factors that would cause them not to enroll in person in Fall 2021



Concerns about students not following COVID-19 safety protocols would have a greater impact on students' decisions to not enroll in person for those that identify with the following races and ethnicities: Asian (61%), Black (55%), Filipino (63%), Latino (54%), Middle Eastern (55%), and/or Pacific Islander (52%). Students' work schedules would have a greater impact on this decision for students that identify with the following races and ethnicities: Black (47%), Latino (49%), Native American (47%), Pacific Islander (47%), and/or White (46%).

Concerns about family members' health would have a greater impact on students' decisions to not enroll in person for those that identify with the following races and ethnicities: Asian (53%), Black (45%), Filipino (49%), Latino (44%), Middle Eastern (54%), and/or Pacific Islander (44%). Concerns about students' own health would have a greater impact this decision for students that identify with the following races and ethnicities: Asian (53%), Black (44%), Filipino (47%), Latino (40%), and/or Middle Eastern (51%).

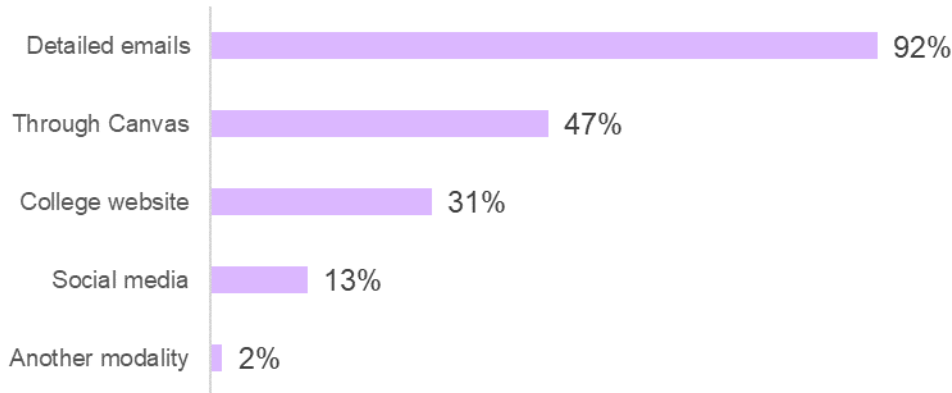

Preference for Communications about Return-to-Campus Planning

Students were asked to select all of the ways they would like to receive information about return-to-campus planning, and the vast majority (92%) indicated they prefer detailed emails. Nearly half (47%) would like to receive this information through Canvas, and almost one in three (31%) prefer to go to each college's website for this information. Only 13% would like to receive this information via social media, and 2% indicated another communication method, like text messaging, mail, and via their instructors.

The vast majority of students would prefer to receive **detailed emails** about return-to-campus planning, and almost half would prefer to receive this information **through Canvas**.

Those classes, even the 2 English classes, Sci-fi Literature in Spring 2020 and Mythology in Spring 2021, which both had regular video meetings(however, not mandatory) on 1 day of the week, I ended up completely forgetting about, while I tried to focus more on the classes I had that were actually Synchronous. Heck, last semester, Fall 2020, I tried to take a Digital Art class that I thought was Synchronous, due to it having a time slot mention on the class's description in the registration, only to later find out that this was only for the 1st day of class and that the rest of the class was Asynchronous. I ended up getting dropped from the class, due to me actually forgetting about it, due to it not having the structured schedule that I needed. In-person classes also help me get, not only my needed social interactions, but also my needed structure to my schedule(which is why I need Synchronous classes, if I am ever forced to do online classes), and also allow me to go out and get exercise that I have been seriously lacking.
