AB2364 Special Admission Nonresident Tuition Exemption Request
- For Eligible Dual Enrollment Part-Time Students-

The term 'special admission' student refers to students concurrently enrolled in K-12 or adult school who have been recommended by the principal/designated official of the pupil's school, have parental/legal guardian permission (students 18 years of age or older don't require parent/guardian permission) to attend a community college, and who enroll in 11 or fewer units per semester.

- The exemption does **not** apply to special admission students enrolled full-time (12.0 units or more)
- This exemption does not apply to students who would be precluded from qualifying for AB540 nonresident tuition exemption upon graduation from High School (students on most nonimmigrant visas like F, J or B). Students with T and U visas are eligible for this exemption.
- Students receiving this exemption do not receive resident status for the purpose of financial aid. Students are still determined to be non-residents of California, but are billed California in-state tuition. Students are exempt from nonresident tuition under this law.

AB 2364, as introduced, Holden. Public postsecondary education: exemption from nonresident tuition.

Existing law exempts a student, other than a nonimmigrant alien, as defined, from paying nonresident tuition at the California State University and the California Community Colleges if the student meets certain requirements. Existing law authorizes the governing board of a school district to allow pupils whom the district has determined would benefit from advanced scholastic or vocational work to attend community college as special part-time or full-time students, subject to parental permission. Existing law authorizes the governing board of a community college district to enter into a College and Career Access Pathways partnership with the governing board of a school district with the goal of developing seamless pathways from high school to community college for career technical education or preparation for transfer, improving high school graduation rates, or helping high school pupils achieve college and career readiness.

This bill additionally would exempt a student, other than a nonimmigrant alien, as defined, from paying nonresident tuition at the California State University and the California Community Colleges if that student is currently a California high school student enrolled in a concurrent enrollment or dual enrollment program. Because the bill would require community college districts to determine whether students qualify for exemption from nonresident tuition, it would constitute a state-mandated local program.

The California Constitution requires the state to reimburse local agencies and school districts for certain costs mandated by the state. Statutory provisions establish procedures for making that reimbursement.

This bill would provide that, if the Commission on State Mandates determines that the bill contains costs mandated by the state, reimbursement for those costs shall be made pursuant to these statutory provisions.
