Competence may also be satisfied through: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Completion of two years of the same foreign language in high school with grades of "C-" or better; • Satisfactory completion, with C grades or better, of two years of formal schooling at the sixth-grade level or higher in an institution where the language of instruction is not English. • Satisfactory score on the SAT Subject Test in languages other than English. • Satisfactory score, 3 or higher, in the College Board Advanced Placement Examinations in languages other than English. • Satisfactory score, 5 or higher, in the International Baccalaureate Higher Level Examinations in language other than English. • Satisfactory completion of an achievement test administered by a community college, university, or other college in a language other than English. • If an achievement test is not available, a faculty member associated with a US regionally accredited institution of higher education can verify a student's competency. The institution must provide a document on letterhead asserting that the student has mastered proficiency in the language equivalent to two years of high school study. • International General Certificate of Secondary Education language other than English "O" level exam with grade of "A," "B" or "C." • General Certificate of Education (GCE) "A" Level exam in languages other than English with a score of "A," "B," or "C". • A Defense Language Institute language other than English course which is passed with a "C" or higher on the official transcript.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- All courses on IGETC must be completed with a grade of "C" or higher. Grades of "C-" are not acceptable.
- Each course must have a minimum 3 semester or 4 quarter unit value.
- Students wishing to use a course to meet an IGETC requirement must ensure that the course is on the approved IGETC list during the academic year it is taken.
- *UC credit may be limited: (1) No credit given for courses taken out of sequence. (2) Credit may be limited for courses with overlapping content.
- **Courses taken at regionally accredited colleges or universities that are not part of the California Community College system can meet general education requirements for IGETC.
- Courses may be listed in more than one area but will not be certified in more than one area.
- Certification is a UC admission requirement and students must request certification from the Admissions and Records office.
- UC and CSU application period for Fall: October 1st – November 30th. Spring admission varies by campus. See the Transfer Center website for more information.
